



Cruise the Indiana Covered Bridges

Saturday, June 8th

Join your fellow T-Birders as we travel the backroads of Indiana to see a few of the 98 historic wooden covered bridges in the State.

We will meet at 9:00 a.m. in the Remke Parking lot just off I-74 exit 1 with a full tank of gas.

At 9:15 a.m. we will head West on I-74 towards Indiana for our driving tour of approximately 150 miles. After we have traveled through (or past) five bridges we will have lunch at Ainsley's Cafe overlooking Brookville Lake. After lunch we will head back toward Ohio passing by one other bridge.



Stockheugter Covered Bridge

The Stockheugter Covered Bridge, also known as Enochsburg Covered Bridge and County Bridge #73, is a historic Howe Truss covered bridge located in Ray Township, Franklin County, Indiana. The bridge was built in 1891, and measures 101 feet, 10 inches, long, 13 feet high, and 13 feet wide. It has a gable roof and the exterior is clad in board and natten siding.



Moscow Covered Bridge

The Moscow Covered Bridge is a historic covered bridge located at Moscow, Indiana, a small unincorporated town in Rush County, Indiana. It is of Burr Arch construction, 334 feet long in two spans over Big Flat Rock River. It is the third longest covered bridge in the state.



Forsythe Covered Bridge

Forsythe Covered Bridge, also known as Forsythe Mill Bridge, is a historic covered bridge located near Rushville, Indiana in Orange Township, Rush County, Indiana. It was built in 1888 by Emmett L. Kennedy. It is a Burr Arch bridge, long over Big Flat Rock River. The bridge has rounded arch portals and decorative scrollwork that are signatures of the Kennedy firm.



Offutt's Ford Covered Bridge

The Offutt's Ford Covered Bridge located near Rushville, Indiana spanning the Little Blue River. It was built in 1884 by the Kennedy Brothers. The bridge is 85 feet long, with a deck width of 15.7 feet. Painted white with ornate black decorations on the entrance, this bridge stands proud.



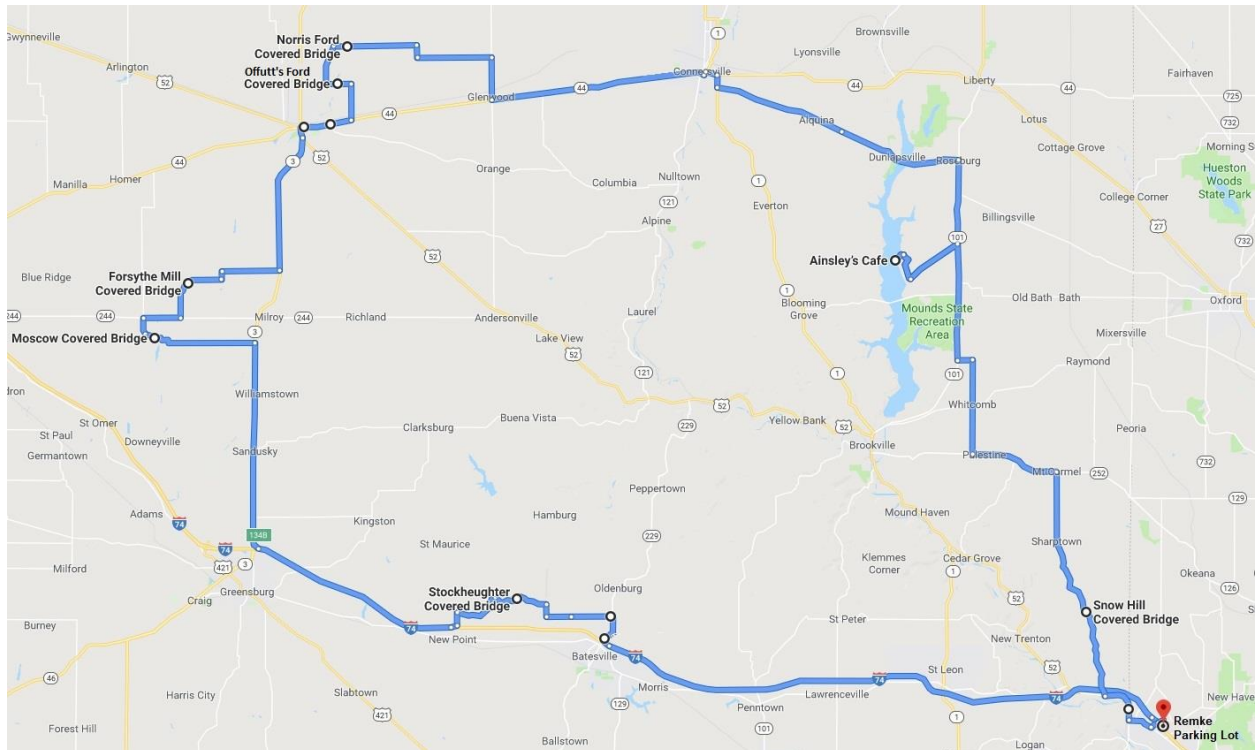
Norris Ford Covered Bridge

The Norris Ford Covered Bridge is located near Rushville, Indiana. It was built in 1916 by Emmett L. Kennedy and his sons Karl and Charles. It is a Burr Arch bridge, long over Big Flat Rock Creek. The bridge has rounded arch portals and decorative scrollwork that are signatures of the Kennedy firm.



Snow Hill Covered Bridge

The Snow Hill Covered Bridge, also known as Johnson Fork Covered Bridge, is a historic Howe Truss covered bridge located in Whitewater Township, Franklin County, Indiana. The bridge was built in 1895, and measures 75 feet long. It has a gable roof, is clad in board and natten siding, and has an open clerestory.



Step by Step Driving Directions:

Use the middle lane to turn left onto New Haven Rd	0.2 mi
Turn right onto the Interstate 74 W/U.S. 52 W ramp	0.3 mi
Merge onto I-74/US-52 W	
Continue to follow I-74	23.3 mi
Take exit 149 for IN-229 toward Batesville/Oldenburg	0.3 mi
Turn right onto IN-229 N	0.1 mi
Head northeast on IN-229 N toward Cross County Plaza	1.1 mi
Turn left onto County Rd 700 S/Pocket Rd	1.7 mi
Continue across N Huntersville Rd to stay on County Rd 700 S/Pocket Rd	1.0 mi
Turn right onto 3 Mile Rd	0.5 mi
Turn left onto Bessler Rd	1.1 mi
Turn left at the 1st cross street onto Enochsburg Rd	0.2 mi

Stockheugter Covered Bridge:

Go across bridge and stay on Enochsburg Rd	1.0 mi
Continue onto E Base Rd	2.0 mi
Turn left onto S Co Rd 850 E	0.5 mi
Turn right onto the ramp to Indianapolis and merge onto I-74	8.6 mi
Take exit 134B to merge onto IN-3 N toward Rushville	8.4 mi
Turn left onto W 900 S	4.2 mi
Turn left at W Skating Rink Rd	

Moscow Covered Bridge:

Go across bridge and turn right onto Water St (changes to S 650 W)	0.4 mi
Continue onto S 650 W	0.7 mi
Turn right onto IN-244 E	1.5 mi
Turn left onto S 500 W	1.5 mi
Turn left onto W 650 S	

Forsythe Mill Covered Bridge: (Do not go across Bridge)

Head northeast on W 650 S toward S 500 W	1.4 mi
W 650 S turns left and becomes S 325 W	0.3 mi
S 325 W turns right and becomes W 600 S	2.3 mi
Turn left onto IN-3 N	5.7 mi
Turn left onto US-52 W/ IN-3 N	0.4 mi
Turn right onto IN-44 E/E 2nd St	2.1 mi
Turn left onto N 200 E	1.5 mi
Turn left onto E 150 N	0.5 mi

Offutt's Ford Covered Bridge:

Go across bridge and continue on E 150 N	0.5 mi
Turn right onto County Rd 100 E/N Fort Wayne Rd	1.6 mi
Turn right onto E 300 N	0.6 mi

Norris Ford Covered Bridge:

Go across bridge and continue on E 300 N	2.8 mi
Turn right onto N 460 E	0.5 mi
Turn left onto E 250 N	3.0 mi
Turn right onto S County Rd 850 W	1.7 mi
(Signs say 250 N/800 E on one side of road and 50 N/850 W on other)	
Turn left onto IN-44 E/State St and continue to follow IN-44 E	8.7 mi
Turn left onto N Eastern Ave	0.2 mi
Turn right onto E 5th St (pass by Hardee's on the left)	0.5 mi
Turn right onto Vine St	0.5 mi
Turn left onto E Alquina Rd	5.4 mi
Continue onto W Dunlapsville Rd	5.1 mi
Turn right onto State Rte 101 S	3.4 mi
Turn right onto Old State Rd 101	2.4 mi
Continue onto S Fairfield Ramp Rd	1.2 mi

Continue on Johnson Fork Rd	3.6 mi
Turn left onto Harrison Brookville Rd/Old U.S. 52 S	1.3 mi
Continue onto N State St	0.5 mi
Turn left onto Harrison Ave	1.0 mi
Turn left onto New Haven Rd	0.2 mi
Arrive at I-74, Exit 1
