America's Packard Museum

For more than 30 years, America's Packard Museum has been at the forefront of Packard historical preservation and education. Located in an original Packard dealership building, America's Packard Museum houses the largest collection of Packard automobiles and memorabilia anywhere in the world, with cars from 1903 to 1956. The collection consists of 50 automobiles and artifacts plus several vehicles on loan from private collections or other museums.

We last visited the facility over six years ago, but because their vehicles are constantly being rotated, there is always something new to see. A brand-new exhibit, *The British Invasion: 250 Years of Revolution*, just opened on April 24. It features British cars from all eras, as well as American cars built for the British market.
