The Early Ford V-8 Museum is a one-of-a-kind museum dedicated to 1932- 1953 Ford V-8 History. Celebrating *Flatheads Forever*, the museum consists of three major sections: an early Ford speed exhibit, industrial engine & farming displays and a 1940s Ford service garage. The Frank Corey Gallery houses many of our 1932-53 vehicles and Floyd Motors depicts a 1936 Ford Dealership. The museum seeks to capture and display the character, culture, and charisma of America's love affair with open roads and the fabulous Fords that helped conquer them.

The National Auto and Truck Museum is housed in historic structures that were once a part of the Auburn Automobile Company. The collection span many eras and genres and features vehicles from the early 1900's, 1920's and 1930's as well as trucks and muscle cars. Museum attractions include an Auburn Automobile Dealership, a model toy gallery, an extensive pedal car collection, the American truck driver gallery, a Hudson gallery and GM Futurliner #10, one of 12 built by GM for the Parade of Progress tour in the 40s and 50s.
