We will meet at the **British Transportation Muse-um** (BTM) at 11am. The BTM is dedicated to preserving the British motoring heritage through education and vehicle preservation. The Museum has 40+ British transportation vehicles, bicycles, memorabilia, and an art gallery. An MG-A coupe (one of 4000) is under restoration at the museum.



After lunch at the Troll Pub, 216 Wayne Ave., we'll travel a short distance to **America's Packard Museum**, the only restored Packard Dealership operating as a museum. It houses the largest public collection of Packard automobiles and memorabilia in the world. The museum features over 50 automobiles on display in the restored Citizens Motorcar Company circa 1917 Art Deco showroom, service department and pavilion. Significant artifacts from the Packard Motorcar Company are also on display. Car Collector magazine named the museum one of the "Top Ten" Auto Museums in The United States. It's not to be missed.



Ford Mustang Sells for \$3.74 million

The 1968 Ford Mustang GT driven by Steve McQueen in the 1968 film "Bullitt" was just auctioned off for \$3.74 million, making it the most valuable Ford Mustang in the world, according to the auction house that sold the car, Mecum Auctions. In front of a standing-room-only crowd, the legendary 1968 Ford Mustang GT 'Bullitt' movie car crossed Mecum's Kissimmee auction block January 10 at the Oceola Heritage Park arena, which was filled to its capacity during the auction as crowds packed in to catch a glimpse and take a photo of the iconic Mustang.



The vehicle was put up for auction by thenowner, Sean Kiernan. Kiernan's late father, Robert, was the third person to have ever owned the car, which has been sold twice in its lifespan, both times for \$3,500, according to Kiernan.

The production studio originally purchased two 1968 Mustang GT stunt cars for the film but the other one was scraped because of extensive damage.

In a statement from Mecum Auctions, they wrote: "In 1968, 'Bullitt' cemented itself as the pivotal moment in the history of car chase scenes, doing what none had ever done before and setting the standard for all that would follow, earning it the badge of honor that it carries today as the single greatest car chase scene in history".

See Better at Night with FoMoCo Embossed Scott Drake Halogen Headlights

Some years ago (when my T-Bird was still painted red), I saw a press release from Scott Drake announcing a new sealed beam halogen headlight, model CODZ-13007-A. Although primarily marketed for '65-68 Mustangs, the

lamp will also fit 1956-1957 T-Birds or any 12V vehicle with single 7" dualbeam headlights. What makes this product so interesting is that it features an embossed FoMoCo logo in the



center of the lens. Drake based the design on a headlight Westinghouse produced for Ford in the 1960s.

Halogen bulbs are rated at about twice the brightness of the tungsten lamps that were originally supplied with our T-Birds, so I ordered a pair to see how they performed.



In the photo above, a regular tungsten sealed beam head-light is installed on the left (passenger) side of the car while the Scott Drake FCODZ-13007-A halogen bulb is on the right. Even in this small photo, it is obvious that the Scott Drake halogen bulb is considerably brighter than the tungsten bulb. I confirmed the increased light output with a Sekonic L-358 digital light meter.

Halogen lamps are a good performance upgrade for older cars originally equipped with tungsten headlights because they produce more light with the same or less current. The higher output of a halogen headlamp throws more light on the road to improve nighttime visibility while extending the driver's visual range. The light is also whiter than a tungsten bulb, which helps with visibility.

The embossed FoMoCo center logo design was not available when our T-Birds were manufactured. Depending on the year (and battery voltage), our cars were originally suppled with tungsten headlamps that had either a "GE" logo, a "W" logo, "12V" or nothing molded in the center.



Even though Ford didn't supply embossed FoMoCo headlights in 1956-57, they are still perfectly acceptable for all concours classes. CTCI authenticity rules make allowances for safety items and only require that headlights be **clear**, **legal**, **sealed beams**. You will *only* lose points if your headlights are dirty or discolored or if the headlamps on both sides of your car don't match.

The Scott Drake headlights add a safety and coolness factor to your ride—for a premium price. They sell for about \$22 each at Amazon, Summit Racing and JEGs.

If you don't care about embossed FoMoCo logos, Sylvania's H6024XV.BX XtraVision halogen headlight sells for about \$15. My tests confirm it to be equally bright as the Scott Drake headlight.

Sylvania's H6024.BX *basic* halogen headlight only costs about \$10. It's not as bright as the CODZ-13007-A, but it's still a significant improvement over tungsten bulbs.
