

Walt's Tech Tips Inspect New Parts Carefully

If you are replacing a T-Bird part, be sure to compare the new one against the old one.

I ordered radiator hoses for my '56 T-bird and worked four hours trying to get the bottom hose on. I went so far as to make a special tool and trimmed the ends to try to make it fit, but then I could not get it to stop dripping.

After much frustration, I decided to order another set of hoses from CASCO. When they arrived, I could immediately see the difference. Both had the same part number stamped on them, but the new hoses were softer, making them easier to install. The center diameter was also 3/8" larger than the old hoses, making for a much better cooling flow.
